Overview

As projects of the Economic Opportunity Program (EOP), the Prosper Portland EOPs follow all EOP Regional Program Standards except as noted below.

There are two Prosper Portland EOP projects:

Career Coaching

These Prosper Portland projects follow the standard EOP design outlined in the EOP Regional Program Standards and focus on career planning and coaching, access to vocational training and job search assistance.

Industry-Specific Vocational Training

There are two training projects that include both occupational skills training and occupational career coaching.

Construction

Pre-Apprenticeship construction training is offered through Oregon Tradeswomen, Inc. and Constructing Hope. Trainees must meet both the EOP and Prosper Portland EOP eligibility requirements to be referred.

Healthcare

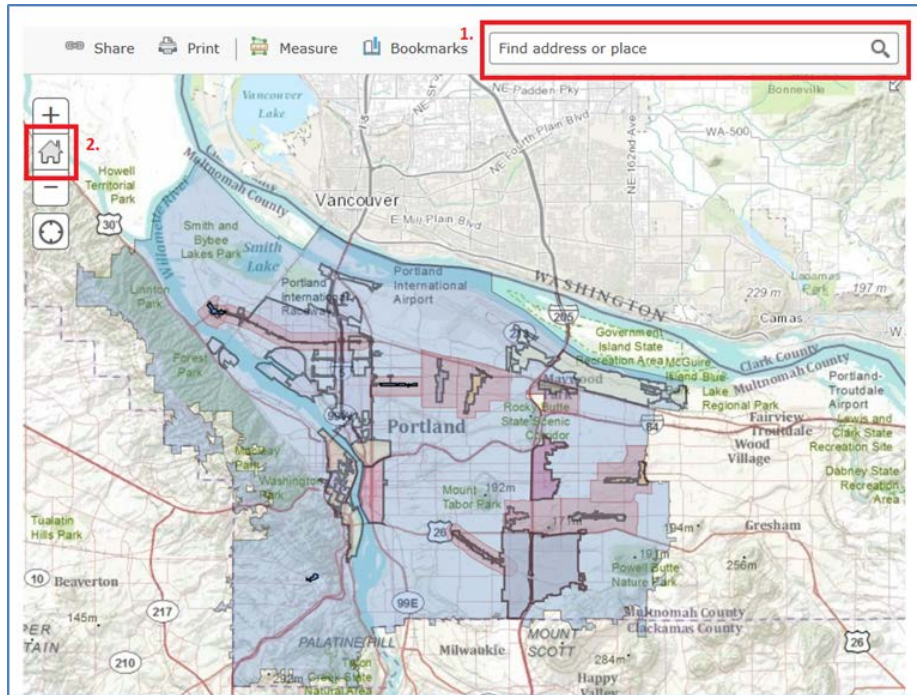
Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) training is available through Immigrant and Refugee Community Organization (IRCO). Trainees must meet both the EOP and Prosper Portland EOP eligibility requirements to be referred.

Eligibility

Residency

In addition to the standard EOP eligibility requirements, the Prosper Portland project has a residency requirement – all participants must reside within the city limits of Portland. Staff must look-up the residence address provided by the participant in the City of Portland’s ArcGIS map (link at <http://bit.ly/M6nyjQ>) to verify this requirement.

Input the address in the search bar (point 1. on graphic) and click the ‘search’ icon. The map will focus down to the actual street location. Once at the street location click the ‘home’ icon (point 2. on the graphic) to expand back out. If the address is within the blue area outline it is within the City Boundary.



Staff attest to having verified the address via the documentation dropdown selection in the Residence control in I-Trac. Participants that live outside these boundaries are not eligible for enrollment into the Prosper Portland EOP program.

Service Definitions

In addition to the services outlined in the EOP Regional Program Standards, the following service is available to Industry-Specific Vocational Training participants.

Tutoring

Services that focus on providing academic or occupational skills training support, helping a participant identify areas of academic concern, assisting in overcoming learning obstacles, and providing tools and resources to develop learning strategies. Tutoring should be structured to lead to training completion or credential attainment.
