Rent Assistance Programs



Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8) Participants pay portion of income for rent (ideally between 28.5% and 31% of gross monthly income)

Tenant-Based

- Voucher issued to the tenant (transferrable)
- Tenants select a home on the private market

Project-Based

- Assistance tied to a specific unit (Not transferrable)
- Property maintains waitlist

Eligible

- Household income at or below 50% AMI
- One eligible citizen or noncitizen

Ineligible

- Subject to lifetime requirement for sex offender registration
- Convicted of manufacturing methamphetamine on federally assisted housing
- Outstanding debt to a Public Housing Authority
 - Must be repaid

RLRA Program

Regional Long-Term Rent Assistance Program

- Local Voucher Program flexible and low barrier
- Funding Metro Supportive Housing Services Measure
- Designed to make it easier and less burdensome for households to find secure housing
- Housing offered alongside supportive services

RLRA

Referrals to RLRA

- <u>Coordinated Access</u> system
- Community-based organizations
- Culturally-specific organizations

RLRA projects include vouchers for youth, adult, family, and veteran populations

RLRA program has both tenant-based and project-based vouchers



Eligibility

- Head of Household has a disabling condition
- Household income is at or below 30% AMI
- Household eligible based on housing status

RLRA

Flexibility

- <u>Tenant screening</u> is not required no mandatory denials or criminal background screening
- <u>Documentation guidelines</u> flexibility with documentation requirements
 - Photo ID
 - Citizenship status not assessed

- Short-term and emergency rent assistance to end and prevent homelessness in Multnomah County
 - Eviction Prevention
 - Rapid Re-Housing
 - Crisis Motel Vouchers

STRA System Targets

STRA System – Placement types

- Eviction Prevention
- Rapid Re-Housing
- Emergency Motel Vouchers
- Serves families with children, individuals, youth –focus on serving BIPOC households disproportionately impacted

STRA Eligible Activities

✓ Rent

- ✓ Security Deposits
- ✓ Rent arrears
- ✓ Motel vouchers
- Housing-related debt
- Mortgage assistance

- ✓ Application fees
- ✓ Move-in fees
- Limited nonleasing expenses (utility assistance, storage, moving costs, IDs)

STRA Access

- Housing supports by community agencies with capacity for assessment, navigation, and range of supportive services
- Access to STRA varies by funded provider
- Need for STRA assistance vastly greater than available resources:
 - Before pandemic, STRA providers could assist approximately 10% of those seeking assistance
- Difficulty accessing STRA is a function of inadequate resources

STRA and COVID Resources

Current resources through STRA

- Have focused on COVID emergency rent relief over past 2 years
- Current funding: ARPA via 8 STRA partners
 ERAP via Expanded Partner Networks
